We know many young people have to take taxis and buses to school or college. We want you to be able to start and end your day with a good journey.
We will speak to the bus and taxi companies and see what training they provide to their staff and let you know; perhaps you would like to be involved in some training for them.

SEND YPN have already started some work on a Taxi Driver 'Charter' (an agreement between the driver and the young people) and we will be supporting them to complete this project. Please let your taxi company know if you have a grumpy or rude driver. If you don't feel happy
